

ENDORSED ORDER granting Delta T's unopposed motion for 90-day continuance in part. (Doc. # 97). While the Court understands the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Court is not convinced that a three-month continuance is warranted. This case, which was filed in the District of Maryland in December 2018, has already been pending for well over a year. In addition, the parties still have more than three months for factual discovery, much of which can be conducted using remote technology. Nevertheless, out of an abundance of fairness, the Court will grant a 60-day extension of the case management and scheduling order. The parties are advised that the Court has an obligation to move its cases forward and will be disinclined to grant any further extensions of these deadlines. Therefore, in order to avoid any further delay, the parties are encouraged to utilize remote technology to conduct discovery until it is considered safe to meet in person.
