Section 337 — Subject Matter

- A trade law statute 19 U.S.C. § 1337
 - Originally enacted in 1930
 - Prohibits unfair competition in the importation of articles
- Provides ITC authority to hear and resolve IP disputes over
 - Patent
 - Trademark
 - Copyright
 - Trade dress
 - Trade secret
- Provides ITC authority to handle other unfair competition claims
 - Gray market goods
 - Antitrust


Section 337 — Unique Requirements

- Jurisdiction
 - Premised on importation
- Domestic Industry
 - An industry in the U.S. relating to the patent
 - Must either exist or be in the process of being established
- Complaint
 - More than a notice pleading

Section 337 — Remedies

- No monetary damages available
- Exclusion order
 - Bans importation of infringing articles into the U.S.
- Cease and desist order
 - Directed to domestic activities and sales of alreadyimported products
 - Has been applied to importation of software

Section 337 — Remedial Orders And Enforcement

- Exclusion order
 - Implemented and enforced by U.S. Customs and Border Protection
- Cease and desist order
 - Enforced by Commission through monetary sanctions
- Sanctions for violation of orders
 - \$100K per day or twice value of imported goods
- Enforcement before ITC
 - Formal enforcement complaint at ITC (19 C.F.R § 210.75(b))
 - Advisory opinion process (19 C.F.R. § 210.79)
- 177 Ruling Process (19 C.F.R. § 177) before Customs
 - Ex parte procedure
 - Used for re-designs
