CONSTRUCTION HEARING**

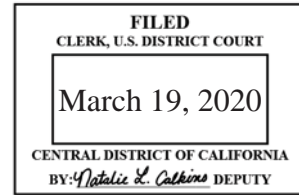
The Court issues this ORDER in response to the unforeseeable global pandemic involving the disease coronavirus 2019 (“COVID-19”), caused by the virus SARS-CoV-2 (“the virus”).

On March 23, 2020, the Central District of California activated its Continuity of Operations Plan (“COOP”), effective through and including May 1, 2020.¹ Among other measures, the plan suspends hearings in civil cases, except for emergency time-sensitive matters, such as requests for temporary restraining orders and preliminary injunctions, as ordered by the assigned District Judge.

Therefore, to protect from possible spread of the virus, the Claim Construction Hearing currently scheduled for April 14, 2020, at 10:30 a.m. is **continued to June 9, 2020, at 9:00 a.m.**

16 WHEREAS, the President of the United States has declared a national
17 emergency in response to the outbreak of COVID-19, also known as the
18 “Coronavirus;”

19 WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California has declared a state of
20 emergency in response to the outbreak of COVID-19;

21 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has recommended
22 that throughout the United States, for at least eight weeks, all gatherings should be
23 limited to no more than 10 people;


24 WHEREAS, local public health departments have recommended that large
25 gatherings be avoided, that elderly and other vulnerable populations avoid person-to-
26 person contact, and that employers allow employees to telework to the extent practical;

- 4 • In criminal cases, criminal duty matters will go forward in the Edward R.
5 Roybal Building and United States Courthouse in Los Angeles only. All

7 course of business. Telephonic hearings on other criminal matters may
8 proceed as directed by the assigned judicial officer.
- 9 • All matters before the Bankruptcy Court will proceed telephonically.
10 Further guidance will be provided by the Bankruptcy Court to pro se
11 petitioners.
- 12 • Chambers staff will be directed to telework except as otherwise directed
13 by their assigned judicial officer. The Clerk of Court will implement a
14 telework policy for the staff of the Clerk’s Office and the Probation and
15 Pretrial Services Office at her discretion.
